

View of Gede from the flower market outside the Cibodas Botanic Gardens


This is one of my favourite places to bird watch or simply while away my time.







Grey Wagtail at Mae Klang at km 14 area near the Vachiratharn waterfall



#### Thailand - Khao Yai National Park

One of the highlights of my last trip to Khao Yai was this pair of Eared Pitta.

#### Notes taken


This bird was first shown to me by a Swedish. VJ and I could only see glimpses of them. Work on the following few days at the same location and finally managed good, long views from several sightings over the next few days.

The general observation made were:

- Body fluffy and head appears small especially when viewed from up front.
- 2. The ears are seldom up and have not seen it up for the female.
- 3. They feed a little apart and were not seen as shown.
- The darker area on the undertail coverts was also seen in the female (differing from that shown in Graig Robson.
- 5. The male's chest appears to have a marbled look (as I had tried to show in the sketch).
- Seen a male on 2/02/2002 a short distance from the first site. This could have been the same bird.

This is made from on-location sketches back at the camp site. The picture is a poor attempt of showing the feeding habit of flicking the leaves and the alert position of the birds. They were observed to flick the leaves rather vigorously when they feed.

The male was seen displaying. It made a short call before erecting the ears and opening the wings a little, trembling them for a short while. It was also seen on a separate occasion to pick up something in its mouth and hit it against a rock, making a pecking noise. Not sure if it is feeding or doing it for other purpose.



Was impressed with this giant and finally decided to put it on paper. Was not able to place a person into the picture to show its size as my skill with human figure at that time was bad.




Giant Buttress along trail 6.


The **Giant Buttress** was done on the spot. It was left unwashed.



The 3 sketches on the right are done in pen. They were done before I learn to use water colour pencil.


# **Myanmar – Pen sketches**

### **Cambodia - Phoem Phenn**




Treasure Hunters of Bo Eng Kak - Phoem Phenn - Cambodia

Rushing Home after School – Luang Prabang
