Bird Report

November 2008

<u>Highlights</u>

SINGAPORE

Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve continued to the "hottest" place in November. The floodgate opened with the arrival of 8 **Great Knot**. This was followed by a bird not seen in Singapore for the past 27 years in the form of the globally threatened and many birders' dream – the much sought-after **Nordman's Greenshank**. While this mega-bird took most of the attention away, other no less interesting sighting included a **Grey-faced Buzzard** and a **Grey-tailed Tattler** which remarkably still had the green tag on its leg intact, indicating that it was tagged at Buloh some 4-5 years ago.

Elsewhere Jurong Lake area also produced its load of exciting finds. Photographers were particularly active here. One lucky photographer photographed a rare hepatic morph **Oriental Cuckoo** and a handful managed to photograph the uncommon and stunning **Ruddy Kingfisher**. We had the first record of the **Ferruginous Flycatcher** in this area, a bird more often seen in the forest rather than a "sanitized" park. And one Hooded Pitta continued to hang around the park area. Over in the new hot-spot at Bidadari, interesting finds included a **Booted Eagle**, **Hodgson's Hawk Cuckoo**, **Asian Drongo Cuckoo** and a **Dark-sided Flycatcher**. Moving further east at Changi Cove, interesting birds included a **Siberian Stonechat**, an increasing difficult to find **Black Drongo**, the beautiful **Chestnut-winged Cuckoo** and an amazingly huge number of some 300 **Oriental Pratincole**. The **Eastern Marsh Harrier** also continued to spend its winter in the grassland here. Finally over in the island of Ubin, a lone female **Blue-rumped Parrot** was the first record here.

<u>JOHOR</u>

Over across the causeway, a trip to the rice field at Sungei Balang produced some stunning images of **Greater Spotted Eagle** and **Pied Harrier**. And at Panti, besides the usual resident, a first winter male **Blue-and-white Flycatcher** was also photographed and the rather uncommon **Ashy Bulbul**.

<u>Summary</u>

This report covers noteworthy bird sightings in November 2008 for Singapore and the surrounding region. In general, the report will include but are not limited to the following categories: rarities, breeding or nesting records, arrival and departure dates for migratory species, new locality records, escapees and unusual behaviour.

In addition, contributors are also advised to be as precise as possible concerning records. Please remember to include details such as how many birds were seen, the plumage, sex and age of the birds, the type of habitat in which they were observed, the food they were eating (if possible, identify the plant or animal), the weather encountered (what was the

wind direction, tide conditions, etc.). Although it is not necessary to have such details for all record submissions, it is a good habit to cultivate and is normally required for very rare or unusual species.

RUFOUS WOODPECKER (*Celeus brachyurus*) 1 heard at Hindhede Nature Park, 30/11 (LKC)

LACED WOODPECKER (*Picus vittatus*) 1 male at Hindhede Nature Park, 30/11 (LKC)

COMMON GOLDENBACK (*Dinopium javanense*) 3 birds in scrub at Admiralty Park on 29/11 (LKS).

LINEATED BARBET (Megalaima lineata)

2 seen 11/11 and 14/11 on a fruiting fig tree at Jurong Lake Park (TGC) could be an indication that this species is expanding its range in Singapore.

COPPERSMITH BARBET (Megalaima haemacephala)

1 on tembusu at Admiralty Park on 29/11 (LKS).

ORIENTAL PIED HORNBILL (Anthracoceros albirostris)

1 near the town centre on Pulau Ubin, 15//1 (LKC)

ORIENTAL DOLLARBIRD (Eurystomus orientalis)

2 at Admiralty Park on 29/11 (LKS).

COMMON KINGFISHER (Alcedo atthis)

3 seen 11/11 at Jurong Lake Park (TGC). 4 seen 23/11 at Jurong Lake Park (SY). 1 seen 24/11 at NTL2 (WCC).

RUDDY KINGFISHER (Halcyon coromanda)

1 seen 9/11, 16/11 and heard 30/11 at Jurong Lake Park (SrG).

BLACK-CAPPED KINGFISHER (Halcyon pileata)

1 seen 7/11 and 24/11 at NTL2 (WCC), perched on the railing of a drain. 1 seen 17/11 at SBWR (TGC). 1 seen 19/11 at Jurong Lake Park (TGC).

BLUE-TAILED BEE-EATER (Merops philippinus)

3 seen 9/11 at TBHP (KK). 6 seen 18/11 at Turut Track (TGC). 1 seen 24/11 at NTL2 (WCC). 3 at Admiralty Park on 29/11 (LKS). About 20 birds at Changi Cove, 2/11 (LKC/YDL).

BLUE-THROATED BEE-EATER (Merops viridis)

4 at Admiralty Park on 29/11 (LKS). One of them was seen eating a large blue dragonfly.

CHESTNUT-WINGED CUCKOO (Clamator coromandus)

1 seen on 2/11 at Changi Cove (LKC/YDL). 1 seen 7/11 at Changi Cove (LKC/LTK). 1 seen 29/11, at Jurong Lake Park (SrG). 1 seen 30/11 in the Ginger Garden at SBG (RC).

HODGSON'S HAWK-CUCKOO (Hierococcyx nisicolor)

2 juveniles seen on 29/11 at Bidadari Cemetery (CMS/ClC). 1 seen 29/11 at Jurong Lake Park (GYY/WF/SY).

INDIAN CUCKOO

(Cuculus micropterus)

1 juvenile seen 6/11 at Bidadari Cemetery, feeding alongside the Asian Brown Flycatcher (FL). 2 seen 10/11 at Jurong Lake Park (TGC) and 11/11 (LJS/TGC). 1 seen 16/11 outside Chinese Garden (FW). 1 adult male and 1 sub-adult female at 29/11 at Bidadari (CMS/ClC). 1 at Japanese Garden, 20/11 (LKC/LTK)

ORIENTAL CUCKOO

(Cuculus saturatus) 1 hepatic morph seen 15/11 at Jurong Lake Park (MC).

RUSTY-BREASTED CUCKOO

(Cacomantis sepulcralis) 1 seen 29/11 at Bidadari Cemetery (CMS/ClC).

LITTLE BRONZE-CUCKOO

(Chrysococcyx minutillus)

1 heard at Admiralty Park on 29/11 (LKS).

ASIAN DRONGO CUCKOO (Surniculus lugubris)

1 seen and photographed 4/11 at NTL2 (TKC). 1 seen on 10/11 near Jelutong Tower, CCNR (GD). 1 juvenile seen 10/11 at Jurong Lake Park (TGC) and 11/11 (TGC/JS).

BLUE-RUMPED PARROT (*Psittinus cyanurus*)

1 female at Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin on 15/11 (LKC). Bird was observed flying from the direction of Johor.

BLUE-CROWNED HANGING PARROT (Loriculus galgulus)

2 seen 9/11 at TBHP (KK). 1 seen 19/11 at Choa Chu Kang St 64 and few seen 29/11 at SBG (FW).

LONG-TAILED PARAKEET (*Psittacula longicauda*)

3 seen at 7/11 and about 20 seen 24/11 at NTL2 (WCC). 20 seen 18/11 at Turut Track (TGC).

FORK-TAILED SWIFT (Apus pacificus)

5 seen 9/11 at TBHP (KK). 2 over TBHP on 9/11 (LKC/LKS). 1 at Changi Cove, 29/11 (LKC/AC)

SPOTTED WOOD OWL (Strix seloputo)

1 seen 16/11 outside Chinese Garden (FW).

RED TURTLE DOVE (*Streptopelia tranquebarica*)

2 seen 24/11 at NTL2 (WCC).

COMMON EMERALD DOVE (*Chalcophaps indica*) 1 female at SBWR, 16/11 (LKS).

RED-LEGGED CRAKE (*Rallina fasciata*) 1 seen 18/11 at Hindhede Nature Park (AC).

WHITE-BROWED CRAKE (Porzana cinerea)

1 seen 30/11 at NTL2 (LTK).

WATERCOCK (Gallicrex cinerea)

2 seen 23/11 (SC). 2 adult male (breeding plumage) seen 22/11 (WCC/LKC) and 1 seen 24/11 (WCC) and 1 photographed 30/11 (LTK). All reports from NTL2.

PURPLE SWAMPHEN (Porphyrio porphyrio)

1 seen 1/11 (FW), 7/11 (WCC), with dull plumage, 1 on 23/11 (SC) and 1 on 22/11 (LKC). All records from NTL2.

COMMON REDSHANK (*Tringa totanus*) 30 at SBWR, 20/11 (LKS).

MARSH SANDPIPER (*Tringa stagnatilis*) 80 at SBWR, 20/11 (LKS).

COMMON GREENSHANK (*Tringa nebularia*) 1 at SBWR, 20/11 (LKS).

NORDMANN'S GREENSHANK (*Tringa guttifer*)

1 seen 15/11 (DL/LKC/LKS/LJS/LWT/TKH/MeT/TGC) and 2 seen 16/11 at SBWR (HB/AC/THC/SY). 1 seen 22/11 (LJS/TKH/THC /FW) and 1 seen 23/11 (HF/LBW) at SBWR. According to David Bakewell, both birds are in 1st winter plumage as they show juvenile wing feathers. This globally threatened bird was last recorded at Changi Coast in 1981, a good 27 years ago.

WOOD SANDPIPER (*Tringa glareola*) 3 at Changi Cove, 16/11 (LKC/YDL)

TEREK SANDPIPER (*Tringa cinerea*) 1 seen 18/11 at SBWR (TGC).

COMMON SANDPIPER (*Tringa hypoleucos*) 1 seen 24/11 at NTL2 (WCC).

GREY-TAILED TATTLER (Tringa brevipes)

1 seen 18/11 (DA/LKK/WC) and 20/11 (DL/Krish/MT) at SBWR. This bird was tagged as Krish estimated, 4 to 5 years ago at the Reserve.

GREAT KNOT (Calidris tenuirostris)

7 seen and photographed 14/11(MeT) and 8 on 15/11 at SBWR (DL/KK/TGC/THC/LKS). 8 on 16/11 (LKS). This is the largest flock recorded in SBWR. 4 seen 23/11 at SBWR (HF/LBW).

RED-NECKED STINT (*Calidris ruficollis*)

3 birds feeding by small scattered inland puddles of water at Changi Cove, 2/11 (LKC/YDL)

LONG-TOED STINT

(Calidris subminuta) 2 seen feeding in small scattered inland puddle of water at Changi Cove, 16/11 (LKC/YDL)

CURLEW SANDPIPER (Calidris ferruginea) 45 at SBWR, 20/11 (LKS)

PACIFIC GOLDEN PLOVER

(Pluvialis fulva)

A number seen 18/11 at SBWR (TGC)

with one still in summer plumage. At least 100 resting on cleared areas of red earth at Changi Cove, 2/11 (LKC/YDL). Another 300 in the same area on 16/11 (LKC/YDL)

GREY PLOVER (*Pluvialis squatarola*) 5 at Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin on 15/11 (LKC)

LITTLE RINGED PLOVER (*Charadrius dubius*) 1 at Changi Cove, 29/11 (LKC/AC)

MALAYSIAN PLOVER (*Charadrius peronii*) 1 pair at Changi Cove, 29/11 (LKC/AC)

LESSER SAND PLOVER (*Charadrius mongolus*) Several at Changi Cove, 29/11 (LKC/AC)

GREATER SAND PLOVER (*Charadrius leschenaultia*) 1 at SBWR, 20/11 (LKS). Also several at Changi Cove, 29/11 (LKC/AC)

RED-WATTLED LAPWING (Vanellus indicus)

2 at Changi Cove, 29/11 (LKC/AC). The birds appeared to be very territorial and chased away an Eastern Marsh Harrier that came too close. Also they were obviously uncomfortable with our presence and kept circling and calling. This may be an indication that the birds were nesting.

ORIENTAL PRATINCOLE (*Glareola maldivarum*)

185 seen 1/11 at SBWR (MS). At least 300 seen 2/11 at Changi Cove (LKC/YDL). 5 seen 7/11 at Changi Cove, foraging as they flying randomly and low over the scrubland together with Swiftlets, House Swift, Red-rumped Swallows and Barn Swallows (LKC/LTK). About 5 again on 16/11 (LKC/YDL), several on 29/11 (LKC/AC) and 1 drinking water by a inland pool, 14/11 (LTK)

LITTLE TERN (Sterna albifrons)

15 seen 23/11 (SC), 7 on 24/11 (WCC) and 15 on 22/11 (LKC). All records from NTL2.

WHITE-WINGED TERN (Chlidonias hybridus)

2 seen 7/11 (WWC). 1 photographed on 22/11 (TKC). 4 seen 23/11 (SC) and 1 seen 24/11 (WCC). All records from NTL2.

OSPREY (Pandion haliaetus)

1 seen on 1/11 and 9/11 at SBWR, 2 seen 2/11 and 1 seen 8/11 at Pulau Ubin (MS). 2 seen 1/11 in flight at Turut Track (FW/YDL). 1 seen 7/11 at NTL2 (WCC), perched on BBC tower feeding. 1 seen 18/11 at Turut Track in flight with a fish (TGC). 2 seen soaring 21/11 at Punggol Grassland (AC). 1 seen 23/11 (TKH) and 2 seen 23/11 at SBWR (HF). 3 seen 24/11 at NTL2 (WCC).

BLACK BAZA (Aviceda leuphotes)

2 seen 1/11 and 1 seen 9/11 at SBWR (MS). 32 seen 8/11 at Pulau Ubin (MS). 1 seen and photographed 3/11 at Bidadari Cemetery (TKC). 3 seen at NTL2 (TKC). 11 seen 5/11 at eastern region of Pulau Ubin, flying towards mainland Singapore (BL). 4 seen

6/11 at Bidadari Cemetery (FL). 2 seen 7/11 at NTL2 (WCC), taking short flight from tree to tree. 2 seen 8/11 at Pulau Punggol (TKH/LJS/LWT). 6 seen 8/11 at Bidadari Cemetery (TKC). 2 seen 9/11 at Pulau Ubin (AvC). 19 seen 19/11 at Changi (TGC). 3 seen 22/11 (TKH) and 4 seen 23/11 (HF) at SBWR. 4 seen 22/11 at Kent Ridge Park (HF). 10 seen 23/11 (SC) and 1 seen 24/11 at NTL2 (WCC). 9 over Telok Blangah Hill on 9/11 (LKC/LKS/ST/TJL/TTC), 1 at SBWR, 20/11 (LKS) and 2 at Admiralty Park on 29/11 (LKS). 12seen at Japanese Garden, 20/11 (LKC/YDL).

CRESTED HONEY-BUZZARD (*Pernis ptilorhyncus*)

55 seen 1/11 and 1 seen 9/11 at SBWR, 1 seen 2/11 and 3 seen 8/11 at Pulau Ubin and 7 seen 12/11 at Tuas South Ave 9 (MS). 1 seen and photographed 8/11 at Balestier area perched on a HDB block (RL). 1 pale morph seen 8/11 (TKH/LJS/LWT). 1 *torquatus* race seen 10/11 at Toa Payoh (GS/LTK). 2 seen 22/11 at Kent Ridge Park (HF). 2 at Telok Blangah Hill on 9/11 (LKC/LKS/ST/TJL/TTC).

BLACK-WINGED KITE (Elanus caeruleus)

At least 5 seen 2/11 at Changi Cove, with one pair observed copulating (LKC/YDL)

GREY-HEADED FISH EAGLE (*Ichthyophaga ichthyaetus*)

1 seen 23/11 at SBWR (HF) is an unusual record for the reserve.

CRESTED SERPENT EAGLE (Spilornis Cheela)

1 seen 29/11 at Woodlands Ave 2 (WaJ) in the morning, perching on a lamp post.

EASTERN MARSH HARRIER (Circus spilonotus)

1 male and 1 female seen 1/11 at SBWR (MS). At Changi Cove: 1 juvenile male photographed on 14/11 (LTK); 1 female seen and photographed 29/11 (TKC); 1 male on 7/11 (LKC/LTK); 2 on 29/11 (LKC/AC)

CHINESE SPARROWHAWK (Accipiter soloensis)

1 male seen 8/11 at Pulau Punggol (TKH/LJS/LWT).

JAPANESE SPARROWHAWK (Accipiter gularis)

1 seen 1/11 and 4 seen 9/11 at SBWR, 1 seen 2/11 and 2 seen 8/11 at Pulau Ubin (MS). 1 juvenile seen 19/11 at Changi (TGC). 1 seen 21/11 at Bidadari Cemetery (TKC). 1 seen 22/11 at SBWR (THK). 1 seen 23/11 at NTL2 (SC).

GREY-FACED BUZZARD (Butastur indicus)

1 seen 1/11 at SBWR (MS).

COMMON BUZZARD (Buteo buteo)

1 pale morph juvenile with very whitish face was seen on 9/11 and another seen 11/11 along Changi Coast Road (AC). Both were seen perched atop a lamp post. 1 seen 22/11 at Kent Ridge Park (HF).

BOOTED EAGLE (*Hieraaetus pennatus*)

1 adult pale morph seen and photographed 5/11 at Bidadari Cemetery (TKC). 1 seen 22/11 at Kent Ridge Park (HF).

CHANGEABLE HAWK-EAGLE (Spizaetus cirrhatus)

2 seen 1/11 and 9/11 at SBWR and 2 seen 8/11 at Pulau Ubin (MS). 1 seen 2/11 at Changi Cove, perched on a lamp post (LKC/YDL). 1 pale morph seen 7/11 at NTL2 (WCC). 1 seen 9/11 at Pulau Ubin (AvC). 1 Juvenile Pale Morph seen 20/11 at Marina Sands (TGC), mobbed by a House Crow. 1 seen 22/11 at Kent Ridge Park (HF), hassled by an unidentified sparrowhawk. 1 dark morph at Hindhede Nature Park, 30/11 (LKC). Bird was calling from the top of an Albizia tree early at dawn.

PEREGRINE FALCON (Falco peregrinus)

1 seen 1/11 at Church Street area (WF). The same individual was videoed 4/11 at Church Street area, feeding on a pigeon on the ledge below the roof of Capital Square (EL). 1 seen 1/11 at Turut Track, perched on tall red tower (FW/YDL). 1 seen 2/11 and 8/11 at Pulau Ubin (MS). 1 seen on 14/11 (LTK) and 23/11 at the Japanese Gardens (DT/SY) feeding on a White-vented Myna.

LITTLE EGRET (Egretta garzetta)

1 seen 23/11 at Jurong Lake Park (SY). 30 at SBWR, 20/11 (LKS) and 1 at Sg Cina, Admiralty Park, a new locality record, on 29/11 (LKS).

CHINESE EGRET (*Egretta eulophotes*)

1 at Changi Cove, 16/11 (LKC/YDL). The bird was actively foraging by the coast.

PACIFIC REEF HERON (Egretta sacra) 1 dark morph at Chek Jawa, Pulau Ubin, 15/11 (LKC)

GREY HERON (Ardea cinerea)

1 seen 23/11 at Jurong Lake Park (SY). 1 at SBWR, 20/11 (LKS).

Singapore Raptors Report Autumn Migration, November 2008

Summary

November again proved to be the main month for raptors migrating over Singapore. We recorded a total of **11 species** (9 in Nov 07) numbering approximately **288** individuals (compared to 240 in November 07) with **Black Bazas** predictably topping the count with 137 (122 in Nov 07) followed by Oriental Honey Buzzards at 77 (58 in Nov 08). I have excluded the records from the full-day raptor count on the 9th Nov so as not to confuse the report. An exciting record for the month was a sighting of a juvenile **Oriental Honey Buzzard** of the *torquatus* race at Toa Payoh spotted by Gloria Seow. This is a race of the Oriental Honey Buzzard is resident in South-East Asia with known breeding records from Malaysia. What are the chances of this race staying and breeding in Singapore in the future? Martti Siponen, a visiting birder and keen raptor watcher spent 5 days in the earlier half of November birding at Sungei Buloh, Pulau Ubin and Tuas. He sent in a personal record of 157 migrating raptors for the month. He had the distinction of seeing the largest flock of migrating Oriental Honey Buzzards (55) ever recorded in Singapore, at Sungei Buloh on 1st Nov. Following this, he documented an excellent record of 44 Black Bazas migrating over Chek Jawa on the 8th Nov. We also had our first records of two Black Bazas and a Changeable Hawk-eagle seen on Pulau Tekong by Avian Chia while serving National Service on this restricted island. Both the Ospreys and Peregrine Falcons were enjoying their winters here at Kranji and Jurong areas respectively.

Four **Eastern Marsh Harriers** congregated over the Changi Cove reclaimed land, a favourite haunt for our Harriers together with two **Common Buzzards.** An odd Common Buzzard was seen outside the Changi area migrating over Kent Ridge Park by Horst Flotow. While we had reports of only two **Chinese Sparrowhawks** over the month, we counted 12 on the 9th Nov during our full-day raptor count. The **Grey-faced Buzzard** (1), **Booted Eagle (2) and Pied Harrier** (1) made up the rest of the migratory raptor species, albeit in low numbers.

Both **Brahminy Kites** (43) and **White-bellied Sea-Eagles** (35) made up about 73% of all the **107** resident raptors reported. Their numbers were a big jump from last month's count of 17 and 16 birds respectively, mainly due to more birdwatchers in the field. But it still showed a very healthy national population, especially over at Punggol for the Kites. The **Black-winged Kites** (15) was also showing a remarkable surge over at Changi Cove with a population of about 10 birds being recorded there. The **Changeable Hawk-eagles** (12) was well spread out with good records coming from Kranji. KC Tsang had a new location for the single record of a **Grey-headed Fish-Eagle** at Clementi Woods. Walad of Naturepixels had a shot of a **Crested Serpent Eagle** at Woodlands.

Autumn Raptor Migration Report Full-day Raptor Count - 9th November 2008

This was our first full day count for migrating raptors in Singapore. Five groups totaling 37 counters fanned out across the island to capture as wide a front as possible. The locations covered were Lorong Halus and Punggol in the North, Telok Blangah Hill in the South, Bukit Timah Hill in Central, Japanese Gardens in the West and Changi in the East.

The thunder storm in the early morning and overcast weather during the day did not help with the numbers of raptors recorded. There were hardly any thermals in the morning for the raptors to soar. We had 6 migrants and 4 resident species totaling 106 birds, which were not bad, considering the weather.

Telok Blangah Hill recorded the highest count with 44 raptors followed by 24 at Lorong Halus and Punggol. Even the Japanese Gardens had 23 raptors. The surprise was at Bukit Timah, where Ding Li had the lowest count of 7 raptors with none in the morning! This was less than 10% of what he got last year on 6th Nov.



The largest species number counted were the Black Bazas (22) followed by Oriental Honey Buzzards (20). Both the Japanese and Chinese Sparrowhawks contributed 12 each.

The bird of the day must be the Booted Eagle at Punggol Grasslands with a Common Buzzard and a Harrier Sp at Changi adding to the mix.

Looking at the times when the raptors were sighted, the peak periods were from 10 -11am with 22 counted. As expected, when the ground heats up in the afternoon, good numbers were recorded from 12 till 4pm with between 17-19 raptors every hour.

John Spencer meticulously recorded the direction of flight of each raptor at Japanese Gardens and it was interesting to see that 75% of the raptors flew generally towards the West (WNW/NW/W). Were they flying there to join the main flock from Malaysia?

We will include Tuas for next year's count and try to get access to Changi Cove for a proper count. The end of the barrage near Marina East would be another good location as it offers an all round view.

We finished the day with a get together at Chantilly Rise Condo, tuck into a yummy Indian buffet while comparing the days sighting and lap up the stunning all action slide show by Lee Tiah Khee.
